4 HJR____ ACKNOWLEDGING THE CRISIS AT THE BORDER AND SUPPORTING
5 EFFORTS TO SECURE THE BORDER.

7 WHEREAS, Texas, Arizona, and New Mexico are facing a
8 border crisis; in November 2022, Texas Governor Greg Abbott
9 declared a state of invasion at the southern border; and

10 WHEREAS, recent figures from the U.S. Customs and
11 Border Protection show record levels of border crossings
12 with no sign of improvement; since January 2021, there have
13 been over 5.8 million illegal crossings at the southern
14 border, and many more have likely evaded apprehension;
15 individuals who cross the southern border illegally are now
16 freely moving about the country; and

17 WHEREAS, during the 2023 fiscal year, U.S. Customs
18 and Border Protection arrested more than 10,800 illegal
19 aliens who have been convicted of crimes in the United
20 States or abroad, including sex offenses, homicide,
21 trafficking of illegal weapons, robbery, and assault; and

22 WHEREAS, during the 2022 fiscal year, the Drug
23 Enforcement Agency (DEA) seized enough fentanyl to kill
24 every American; and

25 WHEREAS, according to the DEA, most of the fentanyl
26 is smuggled over land across the U.S.-Mexico border; U.S.
27 Customs and Border Patrol seized 14,599 pounds of fentanyl,
28 175,410 pounds of methamphetamine, and 70,293 pounds of

cocaine during the 2022 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, drugs smuggled across the southern border are contributing to the worsening opioid crisis; in 2022, more than two-thirds of the nation's 107,081 drug overdose deaths were linked to illicit fentanyl and other synthetic opioids; and

WHEREAS, the crisis at the border impacts the entire country; every state is now a border state, as states are carrying the burden of the years-long surge in illegal border crossings and drug trafficking; states are on the front lines, working around-the-clock to combat the effects of this crisis; and

WHEREAS, Texas, Arizona, and New Mexico are not alone in their efforts to secure the United States border; Alabama is a proud neighbor to these states and stands prepared to respond to this crisis; Governor Ivey has already committed 275 National Guard troops to the U.S.-Mexico border; and

WHEREAS, border security is national security, and the crisis at the border puts the safety of every community in America at risk; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That Alabama acknowledges the crisis at the border and pledges to support the efforts of Texas, Arizona, and New Mexico to combat the crisis and secure the southern border.
