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4 HR___ MOURNING THE DEATH AND CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF
5 SYLVESTER HOLLIS.

7 WHEREAS, it is with profound sorrow that we note the
8 passing of Sylvester Hollis of Birmingham, Alabama, on
9 February 9, 2024, at the age of 75; his departure leaves a
10 void in the lives of his loving family, many friends, and
11 his community where he was highly regarded; and

12 WHEREAS, Mr. Hollis was born on May 6, 1948, in Maple
13 Grove, Alabama, to Willie and Tennie Lou Hayes Hollis, both
14 dearly departed; he graduated from Hooper City High School
15 in 1966 and matriculated to Lawson State Community College;
16 he then attended Miles College where he earned a Bachelor of
17 Science in Elementary Education; he earned a Master's Degree
18 in Elementary Education and a Certification in
19 Administration and Supervision from Alabama State
20 University; he worked his way through college working as a
21 night-shift orderly and a butcher; and

22 WHEREAS, Mr. Hollis had a lifelong, deep appreciation
23 for education, both earning his own and teaching others; he
24 began his professional career as a math and science teacher
25 at West Center Street Elementary School; he was later
26 promoted to work as an administrator with Birmingham City
27 Schools, serving as Assistant Principal of Wenonah
28 Elementary School; he served as Principal of W.C. Davis



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Elementary School, Lewis Elementary School, Effie J. McCaw Elementary School, and South Hampton Elementary School; he was promoted again to Assistant Area II Director and supervised 25 schools; Mr. Hollis gave 34 years of dedicated service to education before retiring in 2003; and

WHEREAS, Sylvester Hollis was a faithful and devoted servant of Christ having confessed his faith at an early age; he joined Brownsville United Methodist Church and gave generously of his time and talents to serving as a member of the Usher Board, as well as teaching the Sunday School men's class and serving as Superintendent of the Sunday School; he participated as a member of the Brownsville Education Committee, which enabled Brownsville youth to attend colleges around the country; and he was a member of the United Methodist Men who hosted events for the church and its surrounding communities of Brownsville, Airport, Maple Grove, and Zion City; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hollis loved his family above all others and will be reunited with his parents; brothers, William Leland Hollis and Joseph Hollis; sister, Doris Ann Brasswell; and brothers-in-law, Jerry Byrd and Clinton Grant; he will be lovingly remembered by his devoted wife of 50 years, Mary Ann Guest Hollis; daughter, Dr. Sylvea L.
