SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, political parties set the qualifications for individuals desiring to run for office as a candidate of that political party.

This bill would prohibit political parties from disqualifying an individual from running for office based solely on receipt of contributions from a particular person or political action committee.

A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

Relating to political parties; to amend Section 17-13-47, Code of Alabama 1975; to prohibit a political party from disqualifying an individual from running for office based on receipt of contributions from a particular person or political action committee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 17-13-47, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§17-13-47

(a) The governing body of a party may fix assessments upon those able to pay, or other qualifications as it may deem
