SYNOPSIS:

This bill makes appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026.

A BILL  
TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The monies in Section 3 are appropriated from the named funds for the 2026 fiscal year to the state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals



28 for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is  
29 intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in  
30 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the  
31 following definitions shall be applicable.

32 "Total" shall mean the aggregate total appropriation of  
33 all funding sources.

34 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services  
35 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be  
36 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or  
37 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended  
38 only for such purposes.

39 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result  
40 in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or  
41 buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of  
42 usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only  
43 for such purposes.

44 "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the  
45 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations  
46 of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

47 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants,  
48 contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the  
49 Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

50 Section 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated the amounts  
51 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive,  
52 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other  
53 functions of government, for debt service, and for capital  
54 outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to be



55 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other  
56 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as  
57 may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the  
58 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not  
59 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the  
60 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through  
61 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that  
62 regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been  
63 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of  
64 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be  
65 made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay  
66 date falls.

67 (b) All appropriations made in Section 3 shall be at  
68 the program level. Any directed expenditure of funds below a  
69 program shall be from funds appropriated for the program.

293 In addition to the above appropriation herein made, there is hereby appropriated for 294 each additional retail and wholesale store that is relocated or put into operation 295 during the fiscal year, an amount equal to the sum required to install and operate a 296 comparable store in operation by said Board. There is further appropriated to the 297 Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the 298 other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to 299 purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and 300 inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to the above 301 appropriation, it is further provided that, in the event any county or municipality 302 of the state shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper 303 referendum, authorize the legal sale of malt and brewed beverages within such county 304 or municipality there is further appropriated, in addition to the amount herein set 305 out, an amount comparable to that expended during the prior fiscal year for beer and 306 license tax supervision within counties or municipalities of similar size and 307 population. Provided further, that the amount appropriated herein shall be reduced 308 in like manner in the event any county or municipality wherein malt and brewed 309 beverages are now authorized by law to be sold shall, during the fiscal period 310 covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, declare unlawful the sale in 311 such county or municipality of such malt or brewed beverages. Notwithstanding any 312 other laws to the contrary, all revenue generated from bailment fees shall remain 313 with the Board to be used for its operations.

The Director of the Alabama 925 Department of Economic and Community Affairs shall report within thirty days after 926 the end of each quarter all grants made by the Department in the previous quarter to 927 the Chairs of the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee and the Senate Finance 928 and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer. The report 929 shall include the recipient of the grant, the source of funds for each grant, and 930 the purpose of each grant. Each quarter's appropriation to the Department of 931 Economic and Community Affairs is contingent upon the receipt of the previous 932 quarter's report. The Director of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community 933 Affairs shall notify all members of the local legislative delegation five days prior 934 to the announcement of any grant made to any entity located in the legislative 935 jurisdiction. The five days prior notice requirement shall be waived in the event of 936 a declared emergency. The Governor shall encourage the Department to disburse the 937 funds provided herein on a nondiscriminatory basis.

3255           Section 4. The State General Fund appropriations in  
3256 this act anticipate a beginning balance in the State General  
3257 Fund for fiscal year 2026, excluding reversions and  
3258 adjustments, of \$333,607,538. If the State General Fund  
3259 beginning balance for Fiscal Year 2026, excluding reversions  
3260 and adjustments, is greater than the above stated anticipated  
3261 amount, then the first \$37,500,000 of the unanticipated and  
3262 unappropriated beginning balance is hereby appropriated from  
3263 the State General Fund to Legislative Council for expenses  
3264 related to the new State House, and the next \$3,000,000, shall  
3265 be appropriated from the State General Fund to the State  
3266 Industrial Development Authority to provide grants for the  
3267 assessment of and subsequent development of sites.

3268           Section 5. Notwithstanding any other provisions of  
3269 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for  
3270 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, to the various  
3271 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted  
3272 on September 30, 2025, are hereby reappropriated to the

3294 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval  
3295 of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein  
3296 shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through

3299           Section 9. Except as may be herein otherwise provided,  
3300 amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in lieu of

3302 such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the maximum  
3303 amounts to be expended for the purposes herein designated and  
3304 in no event shall the maximum expenditure provided for any  
3305 items of expense exceed the amount allocated herein except as  
3306 may be further provided for under this act, as provided in the  
3307 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1, et seq., Code



3308 of Alabama 1975, and those appropriations herein made, except  
3309 appropriations to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board  
3310 for the purchase of alcoholic beverages, are and shall be  
3311 subject to the terms, conditions, provisions and limitations  
3312 of Sections 41-4-80, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the  
3313 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1, et seq., Code  
3314 of Alabama 1975.

3315           Section 10. Any surplus remaining in any appropriation  
3316 herein made from the State General Fund to any office,  
3317 department, bureau, board, commission, or agency may be  
3318 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other  
3319 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when  
3320 such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board,  
3321 commission, or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that  
3322 office, department, bureau, board, commission, or agency.

3323           Section 11. (a) In addition to appropriations herein  
3324 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions, or  
3325 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act,  
3326 including grants by the Congress of the United States,  
3327 municipalities, or counties, to any department, division,  
3328 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office, or  
3329 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and,  
3330 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to  
3331 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency,  
3332 institution, office, or officer to be used only for the  
3333 purpose or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or  
3334 shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal, and



3335 educational entities are authorized to disburse such sums as  
3336 deemed necessary by mutual agreement among said entities, the  
3337 State of Alabama, and the Department of Examiners of Public  
3338 Accounts to partially defray the cost of auditing services  
3339 performed by said agency. All such sums are hereby  
3340 appropriated and reappropriated if necessary to the Department  
3341 of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be

3344 (b) Provided, however, this section shall not apply to  
3345 the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund or the Coronavirus  
3346 Capital Projects Fund provided by the Congress of the United  
3347 States to the State of Alabama from the American Rescue Plan  
3348 Act of 2021, except for any balance of such funds remaining  
3349 from any appropriations made for fiscal year 2025 that remain  
3350 unspent at the end of fiscal year 2025 shall be reappropriated  
3351 for the same purposes originally appropriated.

3352 (c) This section shall also not apply to any additional  
3353 federal stimulus funds provided to the state in fiscal year  
3354 2026 for purposes directly related to the coronavirus  
3355 pandemic, other than additional funds provided for existing  
3356 federal programs.

3357 Section 12. The Department of Examiners of Public  
3358 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary  
3359 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of  
3360 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in  
3361 accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5A, Code



3362 of Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all  
3363 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts  
3364 to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery  
3365 audits as provided for in Section 41-5A-6, Code of Alabama  
3366 1975.

3367           Section 13. Upon certification to the Director of  
3368 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has  
3369 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or  
3370 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby  
3371 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or  
3372 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such  
3373 department, board, bureau, or commission in the amount  
3374 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are  
3375 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter  
3376 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are  
3377 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination  
3378 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are  
3379 not available for the court-ordered payments.

3380           Section 14. All interest earned from funds paid into  
3381 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act  
3382 90-556, and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the  
3383 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of  
3384 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from  
3385 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal  
3386 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd  
3387 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are  
3388 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.



3389           Section 15. All encumbered balances of a previous  
3390 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions  
3391 authorized by this act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama  
3392 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal  
3393 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the  
3394 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the  
3395 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the  
3396 appropriation or appropriations were made.

3397           Section 16. The appropriations made herein to the  
3398 departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies  
3399 include the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards,  
3400 offices, commissions, and agencies are hereby directed to make  
3401 the transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in  
3402 said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated  
3403 in this act and receiving services from other governmental  
3404 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a  
3405 timely manner for such services.

3406           Section 17. All funds collected under Section  
3407 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date  
3408 of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2025, are hereby appropriated  
3409 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for  
3410 the administration of the examiner certification program  
3411 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards  
3412 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of  
3413 Alabama 1975.

3414           Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that  
3415 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President



3416 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 3 of this act which are  
3417 not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate  
3418 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized  
3419 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code  
3420 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of  
3421 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama  
3422 1975.

3423           Section 19. The appropriations made herein to the  
3424 departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies  
3425 include the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate  
3426 shall be \$1,025 per month for each full-time employee for the  
3427 fiscal year ending September 30, 2026. In addition to the  
3428 amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby  
3429 appropriated from the State General Fund in the same  
3430 proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and  
3431 employees are paid, additional amounts to pay for the increase  
3432 in employer contributions to SEIB. The additional amounts  
3433 appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall  
3434 not exceed \$2,500,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30,  
3435 2026. The Director of Finance shall ensure first priority  
3436 shall be given to all State General Fund payrolls, including  
3437 the payroll of the legislature. State agencies may receive  
3438 additional allocations from the appropriation made in this  
3439 section from the State General Fund in amounts necessary to  
3440 pay for the increase. The remainder of this appropriation from  
3441 the State General Fund may be allocated by the Director of  
3442 Finance to those agencies which receive transfers from the



3443 State General Fund. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance  
3444 program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned  
3445 fixed rate.

3446 Section 20. It is the intent of the Legislature that  
3447 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House  
3448 Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate  
3449 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the  
3450 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of  
3451 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds  
3452 appropriated in this act.

3453 Section 21. All nongovernmental entities, identified  
3454 by the Legislative Services Agency, which are allocated funds  
3455 in Section 3 of this act shall file a report with the Chairs  
3456 of the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Senate  
3457 Committee on Finance and Taxation-General Fund, Finance  
3458 Director, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer prior to the  
3459 start of the 2026 Regular Session, regarding the proposed  
3460 expenditures and usage of the funds appropriated in the fiscal  
3461 year ending September 30, 2026. The Legislative Services  
3462 Agency shall provide notice to the identified nongovernmental  
3463 entities within 60 days following enactment of this act  
3464 regarding the reporting requirements and the methodology to  
3465 submit reports and format to be used, which may include an  
3466 online platform.

3467 Section 22. If any section, paragraph, sentence,  
3468 clause, provision, or portion of this act or all or any  
3469 portion of any appropriations herein made be held





3470 unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other  
3471 section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or portion of  
3472 this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or  
3473 portion thereof hereby made not in and of itself  
3474 unconstitutional or invalid.

3475           Section 23. All laws or parts of laws, general,  
3476 special, private, or local that are in conflict with or  
3477 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby  
3478 expressly repealed.

3479           Section 24. Each agency of the state funded through  
3480 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity  
3481 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of  
3482 this state without regard to sex or race.

3483           Section 25. This act shall become effective October 1,  
3484 2025.
