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A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The monies in Section 3 are appropriated from the named funds for the 2026 fiscal year to the state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

"Total" shall mean the aggregate total appropriation of all funding sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be



28 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or
29 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended
30 only for such purposes.

31 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result
32 in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or
33 buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of
34 usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only
35 for such purposes.

36 "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the
37 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations
38 of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

39 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants,
40 contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the
41 Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

42 Section 2. (a) There is hereby appropriated the amounts
43 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive,
44 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other
45 functions of government, for debt service, and for capital
46 outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to be
47 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other
48 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as
49 may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the
50 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not
51 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the
52 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through
53 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that
54 regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been



55 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of
56 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be
57 made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay
58 date falls.

59 (b) All appropriations made in Section 3 shall be at
60 the program level. Any directed expenditure of funds below a
61 program shall be from funds appropriated for the program.

3318 Section 4. The State General Fund appropriations in
3319 this act anticipate a beginning balance in the State General
3320 Fund for fiscal year 2026, excluding reversions and
3321 adjustments, of \$333,607,538. If the State General Fund
3322 beginning balance for Fiscal Year 2026, excluding reversions
3323 and adjustments, is greater than the above stated anticipated
3324 amount, then the first \$37,500,000 of the unanticipated and
3325 unappropriated beginning balance is hereby appropriated from
3326 the State General Fund to Legislative Council for expenses
3327 related to the new State House. The remaining amount of the
3328 unanticipated and unappropriated beginning balance, not to
3329 exceed a total of \$4,000,000, shall be appropriated from the

3434 Section 13. Upon certification to the Director of
3435 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has
3436 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or
3437 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby
3438 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or
3439 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such
3440 department, board, bureau, or commission in the amount
3441 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are
3442 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter
3443 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are
3444 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination
3445 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are
3446 not available for the court-ordered payments.

3447 Section 14. All interest earned from funds paid into
3448 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act
3449 90-556, and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the
3450 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of
3451 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from



3452 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal
3453 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd
3454 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are
3455 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

3456 Section 15. All encumbered balances of a previous
3457 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions

3476 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for
3477 the administration of the examiner certification program
3478 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards



3479 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of
3480 Alabama 1975.

3481 Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that
3482 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President
3483 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 3 of this act which are
3484 not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate
3485 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized
3486 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code
3487 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of
3488 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama
3489 1975.

3490 Section 19. The appropriations made herein to the
3491 departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies
3492 include the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate
3493 shall be \$1,025 per month for each full-time employee for the
3494 fiscal year ending September 30, 2026. In addition to the
3495 amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby
3496 appropriated from the State General Fund in the same
3497 proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and
3498 employees are paid, additional amounts to pay for the increase
3499 in employer contributions to SEIB. The additional amounts
3500 appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall
3501 not exceed \$2,500,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30,
3502 2026. The Director of Finance shall ensure first priority
3503 shall be given to all State General Fund payrolls, including
3504 the payroll of the legislature. State agencies may receive
3505 additional allocations from the appropriation made in this



3506 section from the State General Fund in amounts necessary to
3507 pay for the increase. The remainder of this appropriation from
3508 the State General Fund may be allocated by the Director of
3509 Finance to those agencies which receive transfers from the
3510 State General Fund. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance
3511 program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned
3512 fixed rate.

3513 Section 20. It is the intent of the Legislature that
3514 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House
3515 Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate
3516 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the
3517 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of
3518 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds
3519 appropriated in this act.

3520 Section 21. All nongovernmental entities, identified
3521 by the Legislative Services Agency, which are allocated funds
3522 in Section 3 of this act shall file a report with the Chairs
3523 of the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Senate
3524 Committee on Finance and Taxation-General Fund, Finance
3525 Director, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer prior to the
3526 start of the 2026 Regular Session, regarding the proposed
3527 expenditures and usage of the funds appropriated in the fiscal
3528 year ending September 30, 2026. The Legislative Services
3529 Agency shall provide notice to the identified nongovernmental
3530 entities within 60 days following enactment of this act
3531 regarding the reporting requirements and the methodology to
3532 submit reports and format to be used, which may include an



3533 online platform.

3534 Section 22. Any state agency providing direct
3535 assistance or support to local governments from state funds
3536 appropriated in this act shall file a report with the Chairs
3537 of the House Ways and Means-General Fund Committee, the Senate
3538 Committee on Finance and Taxation-General Fund, Finance
3539 Director, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer prior to the
3540 start of the 2026 Regular Session, regarding the cost of the
3541 assistance provided with state funds and the amount of local
3542 contribution. The agencies shall also provide copies of any
3543 MOUs between the state agency and the local government.

3544 Section 23. If any section, paragraph, sentence,
3545 clause, provision, or portion of this act or all or any
3546 portion of any appropriations herein made be held
3547 unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other
3548 section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, or portion of
3549 this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or
3550 portion thereof hereby made not in and of itself
3551 unconstitutional or invalid.

3552 Section 24. All laws or parts of laws, general,
3553 special, private, or local that are in conflict with or
3554 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby
3555 expressly repealed.

3556 Section 25. Each agency of the state funded through
3557 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity
3558 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of
3559 this state without regard to sex or race.



3560 Section 26. This act shall become effective October 1,
3561 2025.
