6 WHEREAS, with great pride and special reverence, we  
7 commend Dr. Leon Frazier for his many accomplishments; and

8 WHEREAS, he loved people genuinely and served others  
9 selflessly and his departure leaves a void in the lives of  
10 his loving family, many friends, and the community where he  
11 was highly regarded; and

12 WHEREAS, Dr. Frazier was born on May 16, 1932; from a  
13 young age he pursued education, and it became a cornerstone  
14 of his life; he earned a Bachelor of Science in Education  
15 from South Carolina State College, a Master of Science in  
16 Guidance and Counseling from Alabama A&M University, and a  
17 Doctor of Education in Educational Psychology from Oklahoma  
18 State University; he completed further graduate study in  
19 Public Administration at the University of Oklahoma; and

20 WHEREAS, Dr. Frazier's professional career includes  
21 noted experience as a public school teacher in South  
22 Carolina; civilian technical training instructor at the  
23 United States Air Force Electronics Training Center in  
24 Biloxi, Mississippi; and Technical Instructor Supervisor and  
25 Education Specialist, respectively, at the United States  
26 Army Missile School at Redstone Arsenal; and

27 WHEREAS, Dr. Frazier served in many capacities in  
28 higher education as a professor, vice president, and in the

29 Office of Student Affairs at Oklahoma State University and  
30 Alabama A&M University; he also served as a Licensed  
31 Psychologist for the State of Alabama and State Commissioner  
32 of the Alabama Department of Pensions and Security; and

33 WHEREAS, he held positions of leadership with a  
34 number of public service organizations, including board  
35 president of the American Institute of Psychotherapy  
36 Graduate School of Psychology; president of the National  
37 Association of College Deans, Registrars, and Admissions  
38 Officers, and member of the Governor's Advisory Council on  
39 Humanitarian Services; in addition, he was a member of the  
40 job development subcommittee of the Alabama Development  
41 Commission and many other organizations and committees  
42 serving the community in meaningful ways; and

43 WHEREAS, Dr. Frazier's faith-based leadership  
44 activities included serving as the Jurisdictional Executive  
45 Secretary and Finance Officer of Church of God in Christ,  
46 Alabama Second Jurisdiction; and Jurisdictional President of  
47 the youth department for 23 years; Dr. Frazier was Project  
48 Director for the founding and accreditation of the Apostolic  
49 School of Ministry of North Alabama; he provided counsel to  
50 many faith-based projects of churches in the Southeastern  
51 United States; and

52 WHEREAS, Dr. Frazier was regarded highly in the  
53 communities where he resided and served; most notably are  
54 the schools that are named in his honor, including the  
55 Harris Home for Children and Frazier Preparatory School in  
56 Uganda, which has three campuses; and
