### House Bill 381

**House Bill 381** as reported by the Committee on State Government, would increase the obligations of the Alabama Emergency Management Agency (EMA) by an EMA-estimated \$227,180 annually to issue emergency preparedness licenses to camp operators, as well as (1) creating and maintaining a database accessible to certain agencies with approved emergency plans from every camp; (2) maintaining a list of camps with emergency preparedness licenses on the EMA website; (3) considering applications and appeals and providing written explanations for denials of licenses; (4) inspecting camps to verify compliance with the provisions of this bill; and (5) adopting rules and regulations to administer the provisions of this bill.

This bill could also increase the obligations of the Alabama Department of Public Health, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, State Forestry Commission, Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs, and the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency, beginning in Fiscal Year 2026 and ending in Fiscal Year 2029, to reimburse their respective members of the Youth Camp Safety Advisory Council for costs associated with attending council meetings.
